November 30, 2020

The Talbot County Board of Commissioners held a Called Meeting on Monday, November 30, 2020 at 10:00 a.m., at the County Commission Office, located at 74 West Monroe Street, Talbotton, Georgia 31827. Chair Sher'Londa Walker, Vice Chairman Franklin Holmes, Commissioners Ken Chapman, Robert Lanier and Freeman Montgomery were present. The County Manager, Carol Ison was also in attendance.

Chair Walker called the meeting to order.

Vice Chairman Holmes made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Chapman seconded the motion. The vote passed 5-0-0.

A discussion was held in reference to giving each eligible employee a COVID-19 Supplement, using CARES Act Funding.

Following the discussion, Commissioner Montgomery made a motion, Commissioner Lanier seconded, to approve giving all eligible full-time employees a COVID-19 Supplement of \$700.00, and all eligible part-time employees a COVID 19 Supplement of \$350.00. The vote passed 5-0-0.

Superior Court Clerk, Penny Mahone was present and asked if the Elected Officials were eligible to receive a COVID-19 Supplement.

The County Manager will contact the County Attorney to see if the Elected Officials are eligible and report back to the board at the December meeting.

No decision was made on Dot Basses request to place Wi-Fi Routers on county recreation facilities.


The next item of business was discussion to modify the Tax Commissioners Office.


Maintenance Director Ronnie Hendricks presented a proposal to the board for their review and discussion. He recommended relocating the Sheriff's Offices in the building beside the new jail site, moving the Tax Commissioner and Tax Assessors office to the Sheriff's annex, relocating the Election office and the election equipment to the tax office building.

Following a lengthy discussion, Commissioner Montgomery made a motion to support Ronnie's proposed plan. Vice Chairman Holmes seconded the motion. The vote passed 4-0-1. Commissioner Lanier abstained.

Vice Chairman Holmes emphasized the importance of communicating with everyone that will be affected by relocating the offices.

There being no further discussion, Vice Chairman Holmes made a motion to adjourn. Chair Walker seconded the motion. The vote passed 5-0-0.
